About CICW

The Center for Islam in the Contemporary World (CICW) at Shenandoah University is an academic center engaged in research, teaching, training, and outreach on issues related to Islam and Muslims in contemporary contexts. CICW utilizes interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary approaches from diverse academic specializations. It is involved in education and outreach, connecting Shenandoah University to local, national, and global Muslim communities. CICW is a non-profit, 501(c)(3), tax-exempt private foundation. In January of 2019, CICW signed an affiliation agreement with Shenandoah University, which outlined the relationship between the Center and the University. The University provides office space, access to library, and use of classrooms. The Center lends its expertise on contemporary Islam, organizes public lectures, facilitates curriculum development, and provides networking and outreach with global Muslim communities.

Letter from the Executive Director

Al-salam 'alaykum (Peace unto you)!

In the long list of good news for the CICW in 2022, the biggest was the appointment of Dato Seri Anwar Ibrahim, Chairman of the CICW Board of Trustees, as the Prime Minister of Malaysia. We pray to Allah Almighty that his tenure as the prime minister will allow him to actualize his long-standing desire to reform the Malaysian political landscape and institute greater transparency and efficiency.

In collaboration with Shenandoah University and Dr. Mohammad Obeid, our innovative project, VR Pilgrim, provides virtual education and access to Islam's holy sites in Makkah and Madinah. The application has multiple uses in colleges and universities, Islamic schools, mosques and other places of worship, and community centers. We expect VR Pilgrim to be ready for use during 2023.

Our research and publication programs continued strongly in 2022. The Center published two new books, Heavenly Returns, co-authored by our President, Dr. Yaqub Mirza, and a book in Arabic language on the legacy of Shaykh Dr. Taha Jabir Alwani, by Eltigani Abdelgadir Hamid. Both books are freely available on our website.

The Center awarded ten research grants to faculty and graduate students based at universities in the United States and Canada. The topics include democracy and public welfare in the Muslim world, Islam and masculinity in France, Muslim devotional songs in Guyana and Trinidad, and a study of Islamic seminaries in Canada, among others.

Our graduate student institute, "Islam in the contemporary world," attracted many applications from students all over the globe. Fifteen students attended the program and learned from different instructors on a variety of topics. The students came from various countries, including Albania, Bangladesh, Canada, Germany, Saudi Arabia, Turkey, and the United States.

The Center's Prophetic Pedagogy (PP) program continued with innovative and rigorous training for Islamic school teachers and administrators. Over 400 educators participated in the PP program, including teachers from Australia, Canada, Guyana, Bermuda, Pakistan, South Africa, the UAE, Ireland, Romania, and the United States. Another exciting development within the PP program is applied research with Tarbiyah Academy in Maryland to assess the efficiency of Prophetic Pedagogy in K-12 classrooms.

We continued the CICW book talks series on YouTube. Even though we hosted fewer speakers, we continued the tradition of rigorous and involved discussions with leading scholars in various fields. I hosted discussions on genocide in Bosnia, Muslims in Europe and the Caribbean, and the Qur'anic interpretations in modern times. With the return to in-person activities, we plan to host some of these book talks at Shenandoah University in 2023.

We are looking to a productive and exciting 2023. Our VR Pilgrim project is scheduled for completion during the year. We are excited about hosting our graduate student program in person in the summer of 2023. The Center expects at least two new book publications and the completion of a few research projects, including on Islamophobia in the Balkans, in the coming year.

Of course, all this is possible through the generous support of our Board of Trustees and the dedicated work of our Executive Board and administrative staff. For that, I thank them from the bottom of my heart.



ABOUT THE PROJECT

The CICW awarded a \$95,000 Research Grant to Shenandoah University Associate Professor of Virtual and Augmented Reality Mohammad Obeid to create an immersive virtual reality experience that will serve as a training and education platform for the primary religious pilgrimages in the Islamic faith. Dr. Obeid is collaborating with Siraj Studios, a VR studio in Jordan, that specializes in Islamic culture and cutting-edge technologies to complete this project.





Prophetic Pedagogy

Prophetic Pedagogy saw an exciting increase in workshops and short courses this year with several up and coming new specialists in the field of Islamic Education. Our core team of Shaykh Abdalla Idris Ali, Amaarah DeCuir, and Rehenuma Asmi organized our annual beginning of school year workshop around the theme of "Engaging the Muslim Student." We invited specialists in Arabic language, health education, and special education to join us for this series. In the Spring, we launched our first short course series with Sr. Susan Labadi on the topic of "Teaching with the Brain in Mind." We followed this up with a short course in the Fall on the "Prophetic Upbringing of Children" with Shaykh Abdalla Idris Ali. We also have an

upcoming Winter Short Course with Amber Khan, DO on the topic of "Islamic Health Education for Youth." Our short courses appeal to those looking to get deeper insights and knowledge into a topic and they build off our annual workshop series by allowing specialists to cover a topic in depth. Participants from all over the globe joined us during these workshops. In addition to our online professional development programs, we are developing a pilot research project that will explore how Prophetic Pedagogy principles can be implemented in Islamic school classrooms. We hope this research will support the development of our existing programs and improve their impact on teachers and students in Islamic schools.



Imam Training Program

On May 17-19, 2022, CICW held the workshop “Multifaith Relations and Civic Engagement: Understanding the need for Coexistence through Engagement, Cooperation, and Collaboration” with the International Interfaith and Peace Corp (IIPC), the Institute for Islamic Social Science, Wisdom and Action (ISSWA), and the North American Imams Federation (NAIF). Imam Mohamed Magid and Dr. Imrana Umar presented at the workshop. By the end of 2022, CICW joined the North American Imams Federation (NAIF) in promoting and marketing two Professional Development Training online workshops for Imams and Religious Workers. The topics were youth engagement and "brandology."

Launch of the Global Association of Islamic Schools (GAIS)

The Global Association of Islamic Schools (GAIS) began in November 2021 as a small group of committed educationalists with a common goal – to establish a global initiative. More than seventy delegates representing fifteen countries worldwide gathered on Monday, October 3rd 2022/ 9 Rabi al-Awwal 1444, in Istanbul for four days to launch GAIS, and plan the 2025 Global Conference on Islamic Education. Ahmed ElHattab, CICW Executive Board Member, represented the Center and connected with a large number of Islamic Educators. He also presented CICW’s Prophetic Pedagogy program, a globally recognized professional development workshop for Islamic school Educators and Leaders.



[Heavenly Returns](#) starts from a radical premise: it argues that we need more religion in finance and more finance and religion. Though the idea goes against the grain of much conventional theology, authors M. Yaqub Mirza and Gary Moore show that the Abrahamic faiths are replete with wisdom about how followers should manage wealth. Drawing on their knowledge of Islamic and Christian teachings, the book calls for believers to align their spiritual lives and investing choices toward a more holistic, integrated, and compassionate existence.



**A Journey in the Thought and Methodology of Taha Jabir Al-Alwani
by Eltigani Abdelgadir Hamid**

This book is a journey in thought and methodology of Taha Jabir Al-Alwani (1935-2016). It seeks to follow a systematic development of philosophical thought and shed some light on some of the environments in which his ideas were formed. This book is not a biographical account, nor is it an attempt to analyze the person's academic or political contributions. Instead, it traces Al-Alwani's intellectual journey and focuses on his philosophical and methodological contributions.







Executive Board Contributions

M. Yaqub Mirza **President**

After arranging [a gift of \\$3 million for the Center for Global Islamic Studies at George Mason University to launch the AbuSulayman Center](#) in honor of the late Dr. Abdul Hamid AbuSulayman, releasing a new publication [Heavenly Returns](#) alongside co-author Gary Moore, and giving numerous book talks and lectures, 2022 was a successful year for Dr. Mirza. In April, he and co-author Moore were invited to the [Alwaleed Center for Muslim-Christian Understanding \(ACMCU\) at Georgetown University](#) to present their book *Heavenly Returns*. Professor John Esposito moderated the session. Dr. Mirza was [virtually interviewed by the Unity Productions Foundation \(UPF\)](#), an organization that aims to counter bigotry and create peace through the media. He was invited by the [International Institute of Islamic Waqf \(IIIW\)](#) to deliver a lecture on endowments. In the summer, the Boston Islamic Seminary invited Dr. Mirza to a retreat. He was also asked to teach two classes on Islamic Economics at the Islamic Seminary of America. In November, he hosted session four of the [Global Association of Islamic Schools \(GAIS\) Reading Circle](#) and presented his book [Five Pillars of Prosperity](#). GAIS awarded him a certificate of appreciation, and a gift waqf was endowed in perpetuity by Mohammed Zaffar and GAIS as Sadaqah Jariyah and was presented to Dr. Mirza. He continues to uphold his philanthropic legacy through various organizations and is recognized for his humanitarianism by different faiths.


Ermin Sinanović
Executive Director

Ermin maintained robust teaching, research, and outreach portfolios. He taught Middle East politics at the University of Sarajevo, a survey of Islamic civilization at the Islamic Seminary of America, and Islamic systems at Boston Islamic Seminary. He published a chapter on [Montenegro in the Yearbook of European Muslims \(Brill\)](#) and a blog essay on [Muslim Matters](#). Ermin presented at the conference on “Geopolitics of Religion and Culture in the Western Balkans,” organized by Berkley Center for Religion, Peace, and World Affairs at Georgetown University and the United States Institute of Peace (pictured below). He participated at Building Bridges Seminary at Georgetown University on the theme, “Mercy and Grace: Christian and Muslim Perspectives.” In 2022, Ermin delivered two invited lectures on Islam in the Balkans at [Stanford University](#) and the [University of Michigan](#) – Ann Arbor. During his visit to Bosnia, he interviewed for [TV5, an Islamic TV channel in Sarajevo](#), and guest lectured at the Faculty of Islamic Studies at the University of Sarajevo. Ermin continues hosting the “[Islam on the Edges](#)” channel for the Maydan podcast at the Abu Sulayman Center for Global Islamic Studies, George Mason University. He produced four episodes in 2022.



Rehenuma Asmi

Dr. Asmi continues to work on developing short courses on a variety of topics that are targeted towards Islamic school teachers through the [Prophetic Pedagogy Professional Development Program](#). She is also developing a research project on the principles of Prophetic Pedagogy that can be found in the life and teachings of the Prophet Muhammad in coordination with Dr. DeCuir and Shaykh Abdalla Idris Ali. Dr. Asmi participated in a volume looking at Faith Honoring as a pedagogy that could support the needs of students of faith in school settings. The volume brings together perspectives from a variety of faith perspectives on how having one's faith recognized or erased affects one's educational experience. Dr. Asmi serves on the [Imam's Generational Scholarship Committee](#) and was honored to help award an additional [12 scholarships](#) this year.

Member, Executive Board


This past year, Dr. DeCuir deepened her commitment as a public scholar by creating opportunities and accepting invitations to write and speak on education issues facing Muslim students. On February 24, 2022, she published an [historical essay in the Washington Post](#) centering the remarkable education leadership of Sister Clara Muhammad as one of our nation's earliest examples of American Muslim institution building. DeCuir also [documented the significant work of American Muslim youth](#) who have led successful efforts across the nation to close public schools for Islamic holidays. DeCuir spoke internationally at the Australian Curriculum Studies Association and [the Global Association of Islamic Schools](#) to address issues of equity facing faith marginalized students and leadership solutions needed to confront these injustices. Dr. DeCuir continues to contribute meaningfully in academic settings by publishing in peer-reviewed journals and presenting her research at academic conferences. She published in the Journal of Academic Freedom, ["Public Memory Generates Disinformation on 9/11 in Public Schools"](#) (Public Memory Generates Disinformation on 9/11 in Public Schools | AAUP). DeCuir presented her research at the Organization of Education Historians at the University Council of Education Administration. She received an invitation to teach Islamic Pedagogy at the University of South Australia. She continues to be an active member in two international collaborative research groups of Islamic education researchers, one organized by Cambridge University and the other led by the Centre for Islamic Thought and Education.

Ahmed ElHattab
Member, Executive Board

In 2022, Ahmed ElHattab carried a major marketing strategy to promote CICW's Prophetic Pedagogy Professional Development Program for Islamic School teachers and leaders. He also joined the Global Association of Islamic Schools (GAIS) and became a member of its Steering Committee. Jointly with NAIF, ElHattab planned [two professional development workshops](#) for imams and religious leaders attended by over 50 participants. He launched a national marketing campaign for the [Imam's Generational Scholarship Fund](#). Twelve recipients of this scholarship were announced through the production of a [short video](#), and an ad in Islamic Horizons Magazine. ElHattab supervised the English translation, edits, and final version production of Dr. Fathi Al Malkawi book "الهدى النبوي في التعليم". Dr. Ahmed Saad led the translation team which produced the book "Convergence, Parallels Within the Educational Methodology of Moses, Jesus, and Muhammad." He also planned, in cooperation with the American Islamic College and the study Al-Islam Program, the conference ["A Way Forward: A New Mind for A New People- A Historical Perspective on The Ministry of Imam W. Deen Mohammed"](#) on September 23-24, 2022, a conference celebrating the legacy of Imam W. Deen Mohamed and his ministry. Additionally, he arranged for the distribution of Dr. AbuSulayman's book to 50 American Universities Libraries.

Younus Mirza

Dr. Mirza contributes to CICW's various programs and events, such as the summer school and Hajj VR. He recently presented at the American Academy of Religion's (AAR) annual conference about the Hajj VR technology and how the software could be used in Religious Studies. In terms of his research, he has published several articles related to the Qur'an and Interreligious Studies, including "[The Islamic Mary as a Protagonist and Qur'anic Daughter](#)" in *Interpretation: A Journal of Bible and Theology*. He continues to work on a full-length monograph on Maryam to be published by Fortress Press. Younus participated in a roundtable on "[Contributions Toward Defining Interreligious/Interfaith Studies](#)" in the *Journal of Interreligious Studies*. Younus published two blogs with Maydan, the online platform of the AbuSulayman Center for Global Islamic Studies at George Mason University: "[Maryam's Fast: Silence, Spirituality and Miracles](#)" and "[The Building Bridges Seminar: An Exercise in Relational Theology](#)." At Shenandoah University, he continues to be the Director of the Barzinji Institute for Global Virtual Learning and was recognized by the Board of Trustees (pictured to the right) for his work towards building international academic outreach and outreach to Muslim-Majority Countries.
